BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Friend P. Hascall was born in Connecticut in 1799, and married Elizabeth Fairyer in 1839 in Ralls County, Missouri. They had a child named Joseph D. Hascall. Friend P. Hascall died February 21, 1877, in Ralls County.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers consist primarily of Hascall family deeds and receipts, mostly relating to land in Ralls County and Monroe County, Missouri. Also includes a couple personal letters and other family papers.

- 1838 July 28 Patent for land granted to Friend P. Hascall of Ralls County, Missouri, for land in the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 23, Township 56, Range 4 West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Palmyra, Missouri, signed by President Martin Van Buren. **(oversize)**
- 1838 July 28 Patent for land granted to Elijah N. Hascall of Ralls County, Missouri, for land in the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 24, Township 56, Range 4 West in the district of lands subject to sale at Palmyra, Missouri, signed by President Martin Van Buren. **(oversize)**
- 1856 March term Petition of plaintiff Enoch Matson vs. defendants John Hascal and Friend P. Hascal regarding a dispute over land in Ralls County Circuit Court. Also includes summons to Friend P. Hascal and John Hascal to appear in court.
- 1867 Apr 16 Deed for sale of property of Friend P. Hascall and his wife, Elizabeth Hascall, of Ralls County, Missouri, to their son Joseph D. Hascall or Ralls County. Property is located in Ralls County.
- 1871 Aug 15 Receipt of the Office of Collector of State and County Revenue, Ralls County, Missouri, to Joseph D. Hascall for payment of taxes on land described on the certificate of redemption from delinquent land book. **(oversize)**
- 1874 Dec 16 Receipt of the Ralls County Court to Joseph A. Hascall for redemption of land from taxes, costs, penalties and interest.
- 1878 June 21 Deed for sale of property of John Doctor of Monroe County, Missouri, to W.E. Bates and his wife, Harriet M. Bates, of Monroe County, Missouri. Property is located in Monroe County.
- 1883 Oct 6 Deed for sale of property of Lizzie A. Worley and her husband, Hiram Worley, of Shelby County, Missouri, to Joseph D. Hascall, Ralls County, Missouri. Property is located in Monroe County.
- 1892 Apr 10 Centenary High School report in scholarship, deportment and attendance of Miss Ida Hascall.
- 1894 May 23 Letter signed Eldora Bowen, Hannibal, Mo., to Miss Ida Hascal. Mentions the recent marriage of Miss Addie Glasscock [or Addie Glascock] to Beach Drake.
- 1897 Jan 7 Note of the committee, Hunnewell, Mo., to Miss Ida Haschal: "You are requested to be present at the necktie and apron party to be given at the Opera House Thursday eve, Jan 7, 1897 at 7:30 o'clock. . . ."

- 1897 Oct 11 Deed for sale of property of Sarah Topp (single) of Monroe County, Missouri, to William Janes, Jr., of Shelby County, Missouri. Property is located in the town of Hunnewell, Missouri.
- 1899 June 1 Invitation to the commencement exercises of La Grange College. Includes names of the following graduates: Preston M. Todd, Susie Grace Ellery, Omar P. Gullion, Elbert K. Fretwell, Zula Barron Edwards, Vincil Coulter, Elbert D. Cave, Harriet Bates, and Harry Bashore.
- 1899 June 25 Typescript letter signed C.B. Wadleigh, patent and claim attorney, Washington, D.C., to Mr. J.D. Haskell, Hunnewell, Mo.: "On account of a recent Ruling of the Treas. Dept., you can now get the last instalment of your bounty, (if you have not received same within the last eight years) by executing the enclosed blank, providing you were discharged before expiration of term of service on account of wounds or close of the war. . . ." Includes blank form of C.B. Wadleigh titled "Soldier's Application."
- 1900 Jan 14 Letter signed Rob [Robin], Economy, Mo., to "My Little Salt River Friend" [Ida]. Describes her recent trip with her father, Joe, three cows, and a load of goods from Shelby County to Macon County. Written on stationery that includes an image titled "Ambush of Rough Riders." (18 pages)
- 1904 Dec 5 Personal property and real estate tax receipt issued by the Collector's Office of Shelby County, Missouri, to E.L. Blackburn.
- no date Calling card of Preston M. Todd.
- no date Circular titled "A Series of Grand Chautauqua Entertainments. Music and Art Combined! Will Be Given in Spalding's Opera House. . . ." Dr. DeWalt Norton of New York City will present a lecture, and Prof. Alex C. Hopkins of Louisville, Kentucky, will sing.
- no date Booklet of handwritten essays and compositions, including essays on death, anger, education, and other topics. (33 pages)
