BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Adolph G. Schumacher was an attorney who served on the Board of Trustees of the town of Des Peres, St. Louis County, Missouri, at the time of the town's incorporation in 1934.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Collection contains papers relating to the incorporation of the town of Des Peres.

- 1934 Feb Term Typescript petition of inhabitants of the town of Des Peres to the St. Louis County Court requesting that the town of Des Peres be incorporated. (2 pages)
- circa 1934 Feb Typescript census of the taxable inhabitants of the town of Des Peres, presented to the St. Louis County Court. (1 page)
- 1934 Mar 21 List of signatures to petition (3 pages); and list of names not on petition (2 pages)
- 1934 Apr 12 Typescript St. Louis County Court order incorporating the town of Des Peres. (3 pages)
- 1934 Apr 18–May 7 Typescript minutes of the Board of Trustees of the town of Des Peres. Mentions names of the members of the Board of Trustees: Philip J. Goebel, George F. Deutschmann, Adolph G. Schumacher, Edward Niermann, Sr., and Emil Hoehne. (6 pages)
- 1934 Apr 25 Copy of typescript notice of the Board of Trustees, town of Des Peres, of a special election to be held at the business place of William Grupp, Sr., to vote on the proposition regarding the sale of intoxicating liquor containing alcohol in excess of 5% by weight at retail for consumption on the premises where sold. (2 pages)
- 1934 May 11 Photocopy of newspaper clipping regarding an upcoming special election to be held at Grupp’s Place, on Manchester Road and Grupp Avenue in Des Peres, Missouri. Election relates to a proposition regarding sale of intoxicating liquors.
- 1936 Oct 5 Typescript resolution of the Board of Trustees of the town of Des Peres requesting Des Peres residents to purchase gasoline in town since the tax on this gasoline provides revenue for the management and operation of the municipal government. (2 pages)
- No date Photocopy of *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* clipping titled “District Is Incorporated as Village of Des Peres.”
- No date Reproductions of two plat maps of Des Peres showing the names of landowners.
